The German brand will build its own hybrid power unit at its Neuburg facility near its headquarters in Ingolstadt.

Audi is expected to create its own works team by partnering with the Sauber team currently operating as Alfa Romeo.

BALLANDEAN WEEKEND AT THE VINEYARD COTTAGES WINE, WINE AND MORE WINE BUT NOTHING TO WINGE ABOUT

Three Morgan's and a tin top (maybe the wrong terminology as it was a soft top Mini) met on Friday at the BP Blacksoil under cloudy skies but no chance of rain we thought. After a chat to the Buick club members who were also meeting there for weekend, just outside Toowoomba and coffee it was off to Warwick. Luckily we had booked a table at The Cherry Tree café as it was very busy. Here we welcomed the Turnbull's from Toowoomba, now four Morgan's and the Mini. As we left the café the sky had darkened and rain began to fall, two of the cars already had hood's up and the Mini only had to push a button. After refuelling another member decided that hood up was required this left me with hood down and as we travelled to our destination in Ballandean myself and Lee experienced all the fun off top-down driving in the rain. Go fast and you don't get very wet but it's the trucks coming from the other direction that drown you.

Arrived at The Vineyard Cottages in sunshine and after checking in and unpacking it was up to the main bar/dining area for happy hour and dinner. This venue has been owned by Simon and Errol for three years but is only opening to the public in October. It has been totally refurbished and the workmanship/wood work is very high quality and gives a homely feeling as we congregate around the fire. Local wines are served and enjoyed before our three course dinner which was well presented and delicious. The accommodation consists of seven separate cottages set in acres of very well maintained gardens.

Saturday dawned sunny but cold and after breakfast it was onto the mini bus at 10.00am for our winery tour with driver and guide Errol. First stop was winery Bent Road for a tasting and talk by the wine maker in a beautiful long room with floor to ceiling glass overlooking the vines. The talk and tasting were presented by a young man with a passion for wine making, had vast knowledge and added a touch of humour which kept the hour long presentation interesting. Next stop Ridgemill Estate for a tasting of seven wines a mix of red and white in a private room again overlooking the vines. By This time we were running late and so onto the bus and of to the Balancing Heart winery for a tasting and lunch. Our table was reserved outside next to a large dam below the winery which was extremely busy with the lunch crowd. The sky had become threatening again and the wind was cold so after waiting more than an hour after our tasting and no food it was time to complain. The food would be another hour so we were moved inside and at least it was warmer. Eventually fed we headed back to the cottages for happy hour at one of the cottages and dinner at the local tavern. Happy hour did not happen as it was too late and we were all full of food and wine but at 7.00pm Errol picked us up in the bus and delivered us to the Ballandean tavern for dinner. It was a short meal as we were not really hungry, it was cold our table was out on the veranda and the heater was not working.

On Sunday after breakfast we headed to the private residence of Simon & Errol which is set on acres and was once an operating vineyard. The vines are still in place also the sheds and a large cold room which are used for storage at this stage. In the future it will be returned to an operating vineyard. Errol owns a very nice Mustang which is painted in the Shelby colours.

After checking out back at the cottages and saying our goodbyes it was off home on a very warm almost summers day.(Clive)








