1. PRESIDENTS REPORT

We have again enjoyed a full calendar of activities throughout the year, and for the most part all the runs and activities were very well supported. As I remarked last year, it would be pleasing to see, more members participating in our various activities, both in the interests of seeing a wider range of cars out and about, but also to introduce their various owners to the social aspects of Morgan ownership.

My thanks to all the members who "volunteered" to co-ordinate our various activities with again particular thanks to Clive, given that he has been the organiser of five of our outings this year including an excellent weekend that we have just enjoyed at Roma (more of that later).

Our first activity for the 2023-24 year after the AGM was an October well attended excursion to the Brisbane Motor Museum at Nundah organised by Clive, followed in November by Xmas "break up" with the usual good attendance, at the Grandview Hotel at Cleveland. The Hotel is undergoing a refurbishment and the general consensus was that we might be better served changing the venue for the November function this year.

Events for 2025

Clive advised that we have two more events this calendar year. October 5th Cars & Coffee at Coolum/ lunch at Kenilworth and Xmas lunch/break up at a cafe in the Redlands area.

Jon Voller explained that he as organiser, has applied to the council to use public land next to the café park our Morgan's. the council insisted that we have \$20m insurance cover for public liability. The club has increased this cover from \$10m to \$20m and Jon will follow up and advise. We have a private room on the second floor with a view, it is licensed but BYO wine maybe allowed, to be confirmed.

Greg mentioned an outing in 2026 again combining the activities of The Roma Historical Motor Club and maybe 5-6 days exploring the area out West and returning via the coast.

We will obtain a copy of their calendar.

Change of rules ATO tax return for clubs/not for profit organisations.

Clive explained that the ATO have changed to rules for clubs/not for profit organisations and some may now have to lodge a tax return. Investigation so far suggests that we will not have to as we raise income only from members annual fees

and not from outside sources. When lodging our annual return Clive will ask the Office of Fair Trading to confirm that we are exempt.

Clive moved a motion that the Balance Sheet & Profit and Loss for the year ended 30/06/24 be approved/adopted. These were circulated to members with the agenda and will be signed by Greg as President and accompany our annual return.

Greg also mentioned a Scottish Festival in Warwick dates unknown at this stage. John Turnbull knew of the event and confirmed it is worth consideration.


